'Over the weekend 01/12/18 the RGS Rowers took on the Burway Small Boats Head. With the recent great results from Reading SBH, Henley LDS, Fours Head and Hampton SBH our rowers took on the Burway Head. The results were spectacular, along the 3000m upstream course our rowers performed at an extremely high standard. Walking away from the event with four boats racing to first place, four boats finishing in second place and one boat rounding off the podium finishing in third, ending the weekend with a tally of NINE podium finishes out of a possible eleven events entered.
