MFL

It has been a very busy term for the MFL department with a fantastic number of trips and competitions, giving students the opportunity to extend their learning beyond the classroom. I am so pleased that we have exchange visits up and running again - I know how much it benefitted my languages. I am still in touch with a French family, a relationship which started as an exchange and has lasted nearly 50 years. Here is a report from MFL Lead, Miss Shepperd.

Trips

Year 10-13 Germanists and Historians enjoyed a brilliant four-day trip to Berlin from 23-26 October, accompanied by Frau Sheppard, Mr Taylor and Mr Mulholland. Students had a chance to practise their German, as well as deepen their understanding of German history and culture with a jam packed itinerary taking in as many major sites and museums in four days as possible. Just after half-term Y10 and Y12 and Y13 French and Business Studies students then spent a week in Toulouse on the French exchange. This a long standing exchange, but we were delighted to be able to offer it to Y10 this year by forging a link with the Lycée's linked collège. A huge thank you to Mr Geering, Mme Bray, Mme Amarii and Mr Newton for organising and accompanying the trip.

As well as trips abroad the MFL department also regularly organises day trips related to languages. Our fantastic French assistante, Mme Dudrey, took our sixth formers to the Institut Français on 16 October for a workshop on multiculturalism in France and Black History Month. Later on this term 28 Y9 German students will enjoy a trip to the Goethe Institut, and our sixth form German students will go to the BFI for a film study day as part of their A Level German course. A huge thank you to staff and parents who support our trips.

Competitions

So far this year we have had a school @Lancompetition for European Day of Languages (won by Hayden Gandhi in Y10), a House European Day of Languages quiz (won by Windsor), and a poetry recitation competition, which had 19 entries from across all year groups, with the majority of students going forward to the global final. Coming up we have a Y9 languages competition run by GCHQ (the UK intelligence services actively recruit linguists), a class spelling bee in all their languages for Year 7, and the global languages nut competition for Y7-11. We also got the results back from the prestigious Stephen Spender poetry translation competition that took place at the end of last year and are delighted to report 3 students were commended: Ali Aziz in Y13 for his translation and commentary of an Arabic poem, Pugalenth Sankar Muthu Pragaatheesh in Y9 for his translation and commentary of a Tamil poem, and Yusuf Quereshi in Y11 for his translation and commentary of a French poem. Congratulations to all our winners, and good luck to those waiting for results of upcoming or recent competitions. It's always a delight to see how many of our students engage in these competitions to extend their language learning beyond their lessons.
