Boarding

Sport

It has been an epic season for the 1st & 2nd XVs with only one loss between both sides in the regular Saturday fixtures. The 2nd XV remained unbeaten during the season, the first time in 25 years!

Uniform/Dress Code

I am, however, now leading a school.

I am very pleased overall with the way our students wear their uniform or fulfil the Sixth Form dress code; most know that I can see a shirt out from several hundred yards away! There is, however, some creep.

- Trainers seem to have become an elixir for podiatric ailments. To avoid debate, please provide your son with a

- Aiming always to be reasonable, I have held my breath during the cold weather. Quarter zips are not part of our uniform or dress code. This applies to all years.

A 'tight' uniform prevents a lot of wasted time and avoids unnecessary confrontation. I hope I can count on your support should your son be challenged over uniform infractions and, ideally, please have these conversations before he leaves for school.

Co-ed Sixth Form

Thank you to those who responded to the consultation either directly to the school or through the Admissions consultation. All our Year 11 students are eligible for a place in the Sixth Form (as internal candidates) assuming they meet the entry requirements overall and for the subjects they wish to study.

British Algorithmic Olympiad

BAO (British Algorithmic Olympiad) is a new competition launched in 2023. Problem-solving, logical thinking and programming are combined in a single paper covering Mathematics and Computer Science. The competition allows students to explore their interests in either subject.

The BAO was attempted by 13 students. Zaahir scored 87 out of 100 and has been awarded a gold certificate and invitation to the second round. In addition, Zaahir also participated in BIO (British Informatics Olympiad) and scored 100%. He has been invited to the second round.

RGS Easter Revision Courses
