Y8 Activity Day History Trip to Warwick Castle – Friday 28th June

As part of the Enrichment Activity Days being run at RGS this term, the History Department will be taking Year 8 to Warwick Castle on Friday 28th June 2019. The aim is to take advantage of an engaging venue to host an activity day centred on the 'Changing Nature of Warfare' and the 'Reign of Richard III' topics within the Year 8 History specification. As well as the castle and grounds there will be a number of medieval displays to watch, including archery, falconry and a demonstration of the largest working replica of a medieval catapult in the world.
