Personal Message from Mr Venvell



When I first became a Head of Department in 1987, at Kingston Grammar School, I was fortunate to have an excellent Head, Tony Creber, who, though not a musician, understood the importance of support for all extra-curricular activities, and suggested I start a parent support group, along the lines of Hampton School's Friends of Rowing, where he had seen it work well. And so the KGS Music Society was born, and as soon as I came here, I was obviously looking to do the same. So, in the summer term of my first year (May 1995), I invited an unsuspecting group of parents of musical boys to my house, and by the end of the evening, they were the first ever committee of the RGS Music Society! A few years later this was rebranded to be the Friends of RGS Music, as the sports groups were all jumping on the bandwagon and creating their own "Friends" groups. Since then, RGS Music has been wonderfully supported by an

active committee of interested parties, and I can only say that it has been an absolute pleasure to get to know the members of the various committees over the years, and it has been a major plank in the structure of the RGS Music Department. I am so grateful to all the committees over these past 25 years, not just for raising many thousands of pounds, which have enabled the Department to purchase all sorts of costly items, for the benefit of the boys, but also for their constant presence at all RGS Music events, making them sociable occasions, with pleasant and often imaginative refreshments, giving the whole music scene at RGS a sense of style. Some of the most notable efforts have been in the context of



musicals, when we have had "Mindy's Cheesecake" to go with *Guys and Dolls*, or barrows of fruit to go with *My Fair Lady*, and all the committee members dressed to look like the filthy poor in *Les Mis*, and many summer barbecues have ended the musical year with a bang, with a variety of food and drink available to accompany the terrific music.

It would take far too long to list all that has been purchased over the years with FOM money, but highlights include the "new" Queen's Hall Kawai piano in 2000, the marimba, various xylophones, the Hall staging, computer screens for the two main teaching rooms, numerous percussion and brass instruments over the years for class use, many saxophones and clarinets and flutes of all shapes and sizes, oboes, bassoons, double basses, and a host of music technology items.... In fact, a list full of all the things that a state-funded school in Buckinghamshire over the past 20 years simply has had no hope of buying in the normal way. At various times, the FOM have also enabled decoration and improvement to take place in the Music Department much earlier than having to wait its turn in a maintenance budget that is always firefighting, and that has most recently resulted in the 6th Form Music Room (known as Music Tech for historical reasons!) and the Percussion Room being properly redecorated and carpeted.

This has all happened due to the generosity of time and money of you, the parents, led by the enthusiastic Committee. It has always been heart-warming to see the community of RGS coming together for all sorts of reasons, but the FOM certainly more than plays its part in this and helps to make RGS the place it is. Thank you for all your support over the years, it has been a privilege and honour to lead RGS music for the last 26 years. It should not be forgotten that one of the reasons RGS is such a great community is that you, the parents, provide us with fantastic raw material to work with, in the shape of the RGS students, many of whom have turned into terrific musicians, but most importantly of



all, always turn into lovely young men who are a credit to you and the School. I am thrilled that I am leaving the Department in the capable and energetic hands of Francis Mullaly, as I have no doubt that RGS music will continue to flourish under his leadership, and it is, of course, doubly reassuring that the School is led at the top by a musician Headmaster who really wants RGS music to flourish, and, importantly, understands what it takes to make it do so!!

I do not plan to leave the area in retirement, so I look forward to watching the RGS Music Scene continue to flourish, but from a distance, enabling me to have just a few more hours in the week than I have had for 25 years to practise the piano, grow tomatoes, read books, and dandle my grandsons on my knee!!
