Barcelona exchange trip

During the week, the boys visited some of the most emblematic sites such as Sagrada Familia, el Barrio Gótico, Las Rambas, Sitges, etc. Overall, a fantastic trip and we will be welcoming the Spanish students in July.

CCF

Matthew Yarwood (Yr12) has recently been placed onto the Master Cadet Course. It is a significant achievement that out of 60,000 army cadets in the country he has achieved the top 60 listed for placement. Daniel Van Blerk (Yr 13) was also selected to represent the Top 10 Army Cadet forces in the country and whilst he unfortunately did not place, it is the first time in RGS history that we have had a candidate selected. We are pleased also to congratulate the three RGS Old Boys who have recently graduated as Army Officers from the Royal Military Academy Sandhurst.

Oarsome Achievements

From our Head of Rowing (Bruce Gascoine) 'Firstly some news about three RGS boys who have been competing at the highest level of junior rowing – The GB Under 19s Rowing Team Trials to form the crews that will compete at the World Rowing Junior Championships in Paris, the Coupe de la Jeunesse in Amsterdam, the European Rowing Under 19 Championships in Brive and the Munich Junior Regatta. The GB Under 19 trials regatta took place last Sunday in Nottingham and is an important early indication as to which athletes could eventually make it through the process of final crew selection with the goal of a podium finish in these targeted events. The trials regatta is to ascertain competitiveness of rowers (from across the UK) in small boats; singles for sculling and pairs for the sweep candidates. The following boys qualified to participate by surpassing the challenging 2K and 5K ergo cut off times. Their results were as follows:

- Jerry Anderson, who sculls with Marlow Rowing Club, won the B final in a time that placed him 7th overall out of 36 finalists.
- Archie White (J17), who moved over to scull with Leander Club this season, won the F Final in a faster time than some in higher finals.
- Owais Hammad, came in a very creditable 2^{nd} in the G Final which places him as the 38^{th} fastest single sculler in the UK.

I am delighted that rowing is burgeoning at RGS and proud that our coaches have been involved to varying extents in the rowing careers of these remarkable young athletes.

Guanatnamo Bay

We are very keen to promote debate at RGS. Following another school having to dip out, I was delighted that Mr Sarsons stepped up to the plate and organised a showing of 'The Mauritanian' at RGS. This was wrapped in a Q&A panel led by Andy Worthington, Historian, Journalist and UK Guantanamo expert, alongside a former detainee, Mohamedou.

Max Littlewood, Year 12, attended and, clearly inspired, wrote the following: 'Before watching 'The Mauritanian' and speaking with Mohamedou, a former detainee, I thought I knew what Guantánamo Bay was. We had briefly covered the facility in a politics lesson, and I knew that it was illegal, but not much more than that. The reality shocked me. Mohamedou's story remains important as both a powerful tale of human resilience but also as a study into the rule of law; America's continued violations of law and human rights persist even today, with over thirty detainees still being held in Guantánamo Bay. It is important now more than ever to educate ourselves about this issue so that we can act against it and prevent these atrocities from happening again in the near future.'
