AUTUMN RECITAL INSTRUCTIONS: JUNIOR CHOIR (YEARS 7/8/9)

Welcome to all the new singers in Year 7! You have already represented the School very well indeed at opening evening, and I hope you enjoyed the experience. Many of you have continued to join in on Tuesday and Friday mornings, 8.40-9.00am, and were making a terrific sound on Tuesday and Friday mornings just gone!

As I hope you all know from previous communications, the Junior Choir traditionally join in the first formal concert of the year. This is the Autumn Recital on **Wednesday 17 October at 7.30pm**. For that, choristers will be required to be here for the start of the concert and will be finished by about 9pm. They are of course welcome to stay to the end of the concert – approximately 9.30pm. Rehearsals will be on Tuesdays and Fridays as usual, at 8.35am, plus *an extra rehearsal on the day of the concert at 11.05am (Period 4)* in the Hall.

On the evening of the concert, all Year 7, 8 and 9 boys involved should arrive in time for the beginning of the concert and sit in the Hall for the first half. There will be seats allocated for the boys. At the interval, after a chance to go and buy refreshments, they should take their places on the rostra where they will perform. They will perform in shirts, no blazers, so shirts should be long sleeve, tucked in, clean shoes, tie nicely done. After they have sung, they should return to their seats.

If you have yet to buy your tickets (an email went out a week or so ago), don't worry, they are still available (see ParentPay); there are also normally tickets on the door.
