ARTS AWARD – Bronze Award Launch

I am incredibly excited to be able to offer your child the fantastic opportunity to enrol in the Bronze Arts Award programme at RGS. This will be our 6th cohort of ArtsAwarders and have had great success and fun over the different years. With Clay Art, Stage Make-up, SFX, Character Generation, Drawing and Proportion, Harry Potter Magic and a lot of creativity we have crafted an all-inclusive, dynamic and EASY TO FOLLOW programme.

The Award is a nationally recognised qualification, supporting anyone aged up to 25 to grow as artists and creative leaders. Bronze Arts Award is a Level 1 qualification on the Regulated Qualifications Framework (RQF) and is open to young people aged 11 to 25 and is worth noting that the qualification is working at the same standard as GCSE grade 3. Arts Award inspires young people to grow their arts and leadership talents: it's creative, valuable, and accessible. Trinity College London manages Arts Award, in association with Arts Council England.

The qualification aims to encourage participants to develop independence, commitment, leadership, and teamwork through being involved in a personalised programme of art-based activities, whilst learning new skills and helping to increase their confidence. The School fully supports the Award, recognizing its unique value for developing skills and attributes in RGS pupils.

Completing the Award

To achieve a Bronze ArtsAward, young people collect evidence in an individual arts log or portfolio of their experiences of:

- developing their interests, knowledge and skills through actively participating in any art form
- experience of at least one arts event/performance as an audience member and their review of that event/experience
- researching the career and work of an artist, musician or designer that inspires them
- experience of passing on an arts skill
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You can find information here on how long it takes to complete the programme. It is a minimum of **3 months** to complete the award at bronze level, 40 guided learning hours (including curriculum time) + 20 independent learning hours = 60 hours total qualification time (TQT)

NB. The length of time taken for all the Awards is stated in months, but please note they must show **regular** activity and commitment during this time of **at least an hour a week**. They cannot achieve an Award in a short burst of enthusiasm over one weekend!

Places available for 2025/26 enrolment & cost

50 places for Bronze – Enrolment cost £39 (November 1st))

Second instalment- £60 (Due December 15th)

Third instalment- £60 (Due January 27th)

Total cost- £159

Payments are non-refundable due to the structure of the course.

Explanation of costs:

- School Trip to Harry Potter Studios (From 13.00 to 19.00), including minibus fare and a behind the scenes lesson and workshop led by experts at Warner Brothers Studios.
- 10 after school workshops every Wednesday from 15.30 to 17.00, including refreshments (biscuits and drinks) led by our Artist in Residence and Music Arts Award Coordinators. Art workshops include portraiture/ clay head construction, special effects, stage make up and prosthetics.
- Arts Award evidence booklet, certificate and badge (on successful completion)
- Cost of the staff running and administering the Arts Award programme at RGS
- Access to Art equipment such as clay, paint, glazes, latex and a life-size polystyrene head.
- 20 hours of dedicated in school support for the duration of the programme
- School insurance
- Lunchtime guidance for completion of the evidence bundle
- Internal standardisation prior to external moderation (Trinity College London)

DofE

ArtsAward and DofE work closely together. It is also worth noting that the completion of ArtsAward will cover the skills section of DofE.

Silver Award

Once complete the ArtsAwarders will be given an opportunity to enrol on the Silver Award programme. Silver ArtsAward is open to anyone aged 11 to 25 years (designed for ages 14 to 16). This qualification is working at the same standard as GCSE grades 9–4. Silver ArtsAward is a Level 2 qualification on the Regulated Qualifications Framework (RQF) and is designed for ages 14 and above but is open to young people aged 11 to 25. To qualify you need evidence of 60 guided learning hours (including GCSE curriculum time)+ 35 independent learning hours = 95 hours total qualification time (TQT)

Gold Award

Gold ArtsAward is open to anyone aged 11 to 25 years (designed for ages 16+). This qualification is working at the same standard as an A level. Gold ArtsAward is a Level 3 qualification on the Regulated Qualifications Framework (RQF) and is designed for ages 16 and above, but is open to young people aged 11 to 25. The award has **16 points on the UCAS tariff**. To qualify you need evidence of 90 guided learning hours (including A Level curriculum time) + 60 independent learning hours = 150 hours total qualification time (TQT)

How to apply

1. Log into Parent Pay, look up “**ArtsAward Bronze 2025/26**” and pay the enrolment fee. **NB: If you are unable to pay online, please contact the Finance Office to pay by an alternative method.**
2. Once we know the numbers, participants will be given a timetable, including the date of the after-school trip to Harry Potter Studios.
3. The Arts Award booklet will be given out during the first after-school workshop.
