

# **HEADMASTER'S LETTER** 19 October 2023



#### Dear Parent

It's the end of the first half of the Michaelmas Term and I would like to take this opportunity to thank the whole RGS community for their very encouraging start to the Academic Year.

#### **BIRTHDAY BOYS**

Students who are new to the school seem to be embracing life very well indeed. I have heard this already in my 'Birthday Boys' celebrations, which take place most weeks around the time of a student's 12th birthday. It is always (in the first few days of the year) a pleasure to see confidence and excitement grow as the initial nervousness ebbs away with students peering over each other's timetables, establishing the most efficient route to their next lesson, assisted by the elder and experienced guiding hand of the more senior boys.

# FACT

If you have friends/neighbours quizzing you about RGS, here are some stats which may support what I hope will be your very positive (if not, then please do get in touch) experience of academic, co-curricular and pastoral provision. This may be of help if you are quizzed by parents of Year 6 students this week!

- 1435 boys, 174 staff, 70 boarders
- We are usually full from within catchment on first allocation, though some places may become available at second allocation. It is essential, therefore, to put RGS as first choice if families live beyond the High Wycombe area eg. Bledlow, Stokenchurch, GX and Beaconsfield (unless they have a son here already).
- Last year our boys achieved 77% A\*-B at A level; 75% Grades 9-7 at GCSE; 18 boys went to Oxford or Cambridge; 22 boys went off to be medics, dentists or vets (MDVs).
