I can only speak as I find, but the two Inspectors who visited boarding in our latest inspection were very professional, friendly and approachable. They were very impressed with the provision, general atmosphere, attention to safeguarding and the cheeriness of the boys. They are not generally called Ma'am when they inspect settings. ### **Development Fund**

My ongoing thanks to all parents who support the <u>RGS Development Fund</u>. In November I oversaw the disbursement of funding following a bid process, open to all departments across the school to apply for funds to support teaching and learning within their subject areas, over and above the essential requirements that are funded by their Academy budgets. This year your donations have been used to benefit all boys at RGS, funding equipment and projects across subject areas as diverse as Maths, Music and PE. For example, DT students in all years will now be able to use scroll saws in their work and our GCSE and A level students will have access to a bobbin sander machine, adding an additional layer of complexity to their coursework projects. Our Biology Department will benefit from the purchase of 20 stage micrometers and 18 stage callipers for microscopes, helping to enhance the practical skills of our students and encourage a deeper understanding of cellular structures whilst supporting teachers to provide more engaging and effective educational experiences and our SEN Department will be able to purchase two new seating 'sofa pods'. These practical seating solutions offer privacy and comfort for meetings with students and parents.
