Writing an article

Brief: Write an article (500-1000 words) on a topic you find interesting, such as one relating to a university course, apprenticeship, or job you are hoping to go onto after the Sixth Form.

- Set up a **Question** or **Title** relating to the purpose of the article.
- Then write the **Discussion** of the topic.
 - You should provide an explanation of your topic such that a non-specialist would be able to • understand it
 - To write one of the **best** articles, you should give your personal opinion on the topic area:
 - Why do you think the topic is significant or relevant?
 - What are your opinions on the current thinking or arguments relating to your topic?
 - Can you see any future developments within this subject area, or do you have any suggestions on how/what developments should take place?

Ideas

- You could...
 - Source your topic from current affairs. •
 - Look at the topics you will cover in your university degree and write an article relating to one of them.
 - Choose a subject you have seen in class or read about outside of class. •

Examples

History/Politics: What causes coups?

- What work has already been done on this topic?
 - Current theories on causes of coups
- Why is topic significant?
 - Coup in Sudan, April 2019
- My opinion:
 - Whilst most believe coups are caused by..., the example in Sudan has shown..., therefore I believe that...
- Are there any follow up questions which need answering to take the debate further?
 - Now that I have established what causes coups, the next question is trying to prevent them...
