I am writing to invite your son to take part in the 27th annual Wycombe Management Conference, held at Wycombe Abbey School.

This is an excellent opportunity for many of our Year 12 to hear from outstanding speakers from industry and commerce and to experience decision-making in situations that could occur in their future working life. The conference is supported by business mentors from a diverse range of companies. I attach the programme from a previous conference so that you may see what is involved. Please note that the programme is subject to change each year.

Within the terms of the School's policy on charging, I am writing to ask for your agreement to your son attending this conference and to ask for a voluntary contribution of £36. This contribution will include all meals and refreshments during the conference - dietary requirements will be met. In cases of severe financial hardship, please do contact Mrs Chick, the Head's PA (dmc@rgshw.com) in strictest confidence and we will see if there is funding available to assist you.

If you wish your son to attend the conference, please log onto Parent Pay after 4pm on Friday 10th January when it will go live, look up 'Wycombe Management Conference 2020' and pay the full amount of £36. The 86 places for this event (which in previous years sold out in less than 48 hours) will be allocated on a first come first served basis with five reserve places. If you are unable to pay online, please contact the Finance Office to pay by an alternative method. Please note that where the School is required to make non-refundable payments to any provider, we would not be able to provide a refund should your son withdraw from this conference.

As you are aware, you and your son have completed and signed the 'RGS Lifetime Behaviour and Medical Consent form' for RGS day trips'. However, please inform the School of any changes to the medical condition of your son and any changes to emergency contact numbers before the trip.

I would encourage students studying any combination of A levels to apply. All delegates are expected to be committed to the evening event and full day and a half of the conference.
