Examples of this are competitions and sports. The number of lessons you can learn from competing in sporting fixtures or academic competitions is amazing.

In October, I took part in the UKSDC (UK space design competition). This competition taught me so much about general physics and design technology. The amount of work that went into the design by our whole team which consisted of several Year 12 and Year 13 students was amazing and the collaboration between us and Wycombe High School was great. 
