The Duke of Edinburgh's Award,

DofE is the world's leading achievement award for young people, and is highly regarded by universities, colleges and employers. It encourages young people to develop independence, commitment, leadership and teamwork through being involved in a personalised programme of activities.

It will inspire your son to make a difference to the local community, learn new skills, become fitter through sport and expeditions and increase his confidence. The School fully supports the Award, recognizing its unique value for developing skills and attributes in RGS.

Completing the Award

The Award is achieved by completing a personal programme of activities in four sections. These sections are:

- Volunteering helping someone, your community or the environment
- Physical becoming fitter through sport, dance or fitness activities
- Skills developing existing talents or trying something new
- **Expedition** planning/training/completing an adventurous journey (this section is organised by the School)
- Residential for those undertaking their GOLD award this is an additional section outside Volunteering, Skills, Physical and Expedition. We advise that you check with the School before booking your Residential section to ensure it meets the DofE criteria. A 'residential' for Gold DofE means a programme that spends 5 days and 4 nights away from home on a shared activity with people that you have never met before.

Your residential can have any focus or include any activities that you wish; a guide can be found here.

You can find information here on how long it takes to complete the programme and the amount of time that needs to be given to any one specific section (<u>DofE Timescales</u>). On average it is a minimum of **6 months** to complete Silver and **12 months** for Gold (18 months if you sign up without completing Silver first). Your son must be 15 years old to sign up for Silver and 16 years for Gold.

NB. The length of time taken for all the Awards is stated in months. Please note a student must show **regular** activity and commitment during this time of **at least an hour a week**. He cannot achieve an Award in a short burst of enthusiasm over one weekend! Finally, all DofE activities **must** be completed by his 25th birthday.

Places available for 2022/23 enrolment and cost

50 places for Silver Enrolment cost £129 35 places for Gold Enrolment cost £136

Explanation of costs:

- DofE Welcome Pack, eDofE account, certificate and badge (on successful completion)
- Invitation for you plus 1 guest to attend a formal award ceremony at Buckingham Palace (or other royal palace) GOLD AWARDS ONLY
- Cost of the staff running and administering the DofE award at RGS
- Licence fee to DofE South East Regional Office
- In school training sessions
- Dedicated in school support for the duration of your programme
- Maps and navigational equipment
- Access to group kit and camping equipment (tents, stoves, etc)
- School insurance
- Certificate and badge upon successful completion

The following are not included:

- Cost of the expedition section
- Personal camping/trekking equipment (RGS has a supply of loan kit if required))
- Additional costs relating to completion of other sections of the Award.

NB: We would not want any RGS parent to not consider this opportunity due to cost. If you would find this financially difficult, please contact me in strictest confidence, as there may be funding available to assist you.

Expedition Section

DofE is not just about the expedition, but we know it is an important part of the programme and one that students look forward to and enjoy.

• Silver Training, Practice (3days, 2 nights) and Qualifying Expeditions (3 days, 3 nights) £350 -£395* **Provisional Expedition dates:**

1st – 3rd March 2023 Training/Practice Expedition (based in the Chiltern Hills) 31st March – 3rd April 2023 Qualifying Expedition (based in the Peak District)

• Gold Training, Practice (4 days, 4 nights) and Qualifying Expeditions (4 days, 4 nights) £550- £595* **Provisional Expedition dates:**

31st March – 4th April 2023 Training/Practice Expedition (based in the Peak District)

• 1st – 4th July 2023 Qualifying Expedition (based in North Wales) (Expedition assessment will depart after school on 30th June)

*Please note the final cost will be decided at the end of the Autumn term once we know exactly how many boys are signed up for each level. However, the above figures should give you a rough indication.

Please refer to the <u>DofE Essential Kit List.</u> Full details of what group kit will be supplied and what kit you must supply yourselves will be issued by the end of the autumn term. A limited supply of kit will be available on loan, at no cost, from the RGS DofE stores.

How to apply

- 1. Log into Parent Pay before Tuesday 4th November, look up either "DofE Silver 2022/23" or "DofE Gold 2022/23" and pay the Enrolment fee. NB: If you are unable to pay online, please contact the Finance Office to pay by an alternative method.
- 2. On receipt of the enrolment fee, we will process your son's application and he will receive an automated email to his RGS email address containing his eDofE login details. (*Please note that no refunds are available after* **7**th **November** *should your son chose to withdraw from the programme*)
- 3. Your son can start any of his activities immediately. It is essential that all activities are selected from the approved <u>DofE Programme Ideas List.</u> If an activity is listed under Physical, it cannot be used for Skills and vice versa. If you or your son are unsure about an activity he has selected, please contact <u>DofE@rgshw.com</u> as soon as possible for clarification.
- 4. Welcome packs will be sent to you directly from DofE once you complete your eDofE registration, however, you can access Digital Welcome Packs <u>here.</u>
