Dear Parents

#### Home testing

By this time next week all students will have completed their third lateral flow test at school. Once the third test is complete the students will start their home testing. This <u>link</u> will take you to the home testing letter which I would urge you to read. I will just highlight a few key points:

- All students should do their home testing on a Sunday and Wednesday evening (with the exception of Year 13 next week (see letter for details).
- All test results must be recorded on the Government website and on the School's Microsoft Form here.
- If a positive result:
  - o please contact <u>attendance@rgshw.com</u>
  - self-isolate, including household members, and book a PCR test. Get a free NHS test to check if you have coronavirus - GOV.UK (<u>www.gov.uk</u>)
  - o School will commence close contact tracing
- If it is a void result
  - o repeat the test
  - o if the repeat test is void, then treat and record as a positive result and follow the instructions above
  - o if the repeat test is negative, then treat and record as a negative result
- If it is a negative result:
  - o continue as usual, provided you remain asymptomatic

## Parental Microsoft Teams assignment summary - weekly email

From Sunday 14 March, parents will receive a weekly email from Microsoft Office 365 summarising the assignments which have been set and handed in by boys on Teams. You should receive the email by 6.00am every Sunday. It will succinctly show what work has been set as an assignment on Teams and when it is due in. It will also show whether that work has been handed in or not, which we hope will provide a useful stimulus for parental conversations with sons about their work. This email is intended as a tool to increase parental awareness of what work has been set and submitted by boys on Teams. We have implemented the scheme following a limited trial with Year 7 parents which resulted in very positive feedback and our consequent decision to make this facility available to all parents.
