


HEADMASTER'S LETTER 7 September 2021







Dear Parent

The fine weather contrasts with the autumnal gloom of the end of August. It was a beautiful day yesterday, as we all gathered together for the first time for many weeks.

The staff, of course, were in work for some of the previous week and there was a palpable 'buzz' as we held various staff meetings, training sessions and had our communal lunches.

Yesterday, however, for most staff was the day they had been looking forward to. It was a sheer delight to be able to hold assemblies again in the Queen's Hall, albeit in much smaller groups than we had before the pandemic. As I walked around the School, it was clear that lessons were underway and that the calm, relaxed but purposeful atmosphere was here again.
