Dear Parent/Carer

Your child's annual flu vaccination is now due.

This vaccination programme is in place to help protect your child against flu, which can be an unpleasant illness and sometimes causes serious complications. This year, with COVID-19 in circulation, it's more important than ever that eligible groups are vaccinated to protect them from flu. The free flu vaccine will help prevent them getting the flu and is the best protection from the flu virus. Vaccinating your child will also help protect more vulnerable friends and family by preventing the spread of flu.

The intra-nasal flu vaccine is the most effective protection for your child against flu. **However, if in the past you have refused the intra-nasal vaccine due to PORCINE GELATINE content, we are now able to offer an alternative injectable flu vaccine which is porcine-free. Please complete the consent form stating that you would like your child to have the IM flu vaccine.** This IM vaccine can be given in school, but if you would prefer to be with your child, please contact the immunisation team after submitting your consent form on 01494 323000 or by email on: bht-tr.buckschildimms@nhs.net to arrange a clinic appointment.

We will be visiting your child's school on **09/12/2022** so please complete the consent form in full using the following school code: EE136484. **If a consent form is not completed by midday the day before our visit your child may not receive their immunisation at school.**

The vaccination is free and recommended for children and young people. It will be given by a quick and simple spray up the nose.
