Dear Parent/Carer

Human Papillomavirus (HPV 1) Vaccination

All pupils in year 8 are offered the opportunity to receive the HPV vaccine as part of the National Childhood Immunisation Schedule. The HPV vaccine protects against cancer of the cervix (girls), head and neck, genital and anal area in both girls and boys. It is a course of two injections, at least six months apart. You will only need to consent once for both injections.

We will be visiting your child's school on **22/09/2022**. Please complete the consent form in full using the following school code: **EE136484** no later than **3pm** on **20/09/2022 as the link will close on this date**. If you consent after this date your child may not be able to receive their immunisations on the day and a link will be sent to you offering an appointment at one of our catch up clinics based in Aylesbury and Amersham.

A recent study published in The Lancet, 3rd November 2021, observed a substantial reduction in Cervical Cancer incidence after the introduction of the HPV programme in England, with a 97% reduction for those receiving the vaccination between the ages of 12-13yrs old.
