Dear Parent

IN QUIRES AND PLACES

By the time you receive this, around 100 of our boys will be on a coach returning from London. Our choir normally sings the service of Choral Evensong at one of the Oxford college chapels, but they are rather too small for 100 to socially distance safely. Thanks to the Rector of the church of St Giles in the Fields, in the West End (a large, galleried, beautiful Palladian church off Tottenham Court Road) we have been able to rehearse and record the service there. TESTING

Thank you for your continued engagement in the Covid-19 testing programme. Please continue to test twice weekly and report your results until the end of this week. The asymptomatic testing programme is being paused over the summer holidays. You should only participate in the asymptomatic testing programme if you are attending school over the summer for any reason. We are unsure about the Covid situation we will face in the autumn, so we want to be prepared for all scenarios. Subject to public health advice, testing may restart on return in the autumn. If it does, we have supplied your son with enough tests to ensure he can test twice before his return in September. We expect two tests to be conducted on Wednesday 1 September and Sunday 5 September. A further reminder will be sent out nearer the time. We will strongly encourage all students to take these tests so we can keep the school as safe as possible for the return.

You must report your child's test results, even if their result is negative or void. You should also keep a note of and share your child's results <u>here</u> and with the government at <u>report a COVID-19 lateral flow test result</u>

We will test all new Year 7 students twice on site.

The government will continue to review the future need for testing in light of any changes to the public health situation.
