Personal Statements

DO NOT PLAGIARISE.

Universities are looking for:

- A clear understanding of what the course entails
- Commitment to the discipline (includes broad reading and extra curricular activities)
- Commitment to the study of X, coupled with curiosity about the study of a diverse range of X

- Ability to make connections between X and Y
- Ability to develop independent opinions and arguments on X, and use them to sustain an argument, identify weaknesses in other arguments and respond to criticisms
- Willingness to think creatively about using evidence from a range of sources
- Examples are key demonstrate by using concrete evidence > evaluate > reflect

PRE-A LEVEL UNCONDITIONAL OFFERS – should be greatly reduced or non-existent this year

- Over the second s
- Could coast to lower grades not good on CV
- Could make the wrong choice
- Sel pressured to make a decision / direct contact from unis (just say no)
- ONLY ACCEPT AN UNCONDITIONAL OFFER IF YOU WOULD HAVE ACCEPTED IT AS A CONDITIONAL OFFER

- NB: Conservatoires/foreign universities have their own deadlines – your responsibility to know them
