SIXTH FORM CENTRE CAMPAIGN

I should like to acknowledge the incredible support of parents who have given generous gifts towards our Sixth Form Centre Campaign. At the time of writing, we have received nearly £430,000. This is so very much appreciated. I am very grateful to the Campaign Board who have supported parents in the giving process and have spoken passionately about the gamechanger of a project. There is one final Campaign Event taking place on Monday evening from 7pm, starting with a glass of fizz and a mince pie in the Upper Library. There will be an added bonus for this particular event as I shall be able to show parents the 'work in process' and explain the developments in a little more detail. The furniture for the downstairs study area is being manufactured and will be delivered and erected before the end of term.

Other capital works

The Sports Hall roof work is almost complete, with the solar panels due to be installed in early January. We are taking the opportunity to redecorate the Sports Hall and surrounding area and, once the Pool work is complete in March, we will refresh the paintwork in the area which leads to the pool, Sports Hall and Restaurant.

There has been inevitable disruption to events, to those who hire the premises and, on a daily basis, to staff who have had talks and lessons interrupted by drills, hammers and saws! This level of investment is unprecedented at the school, certainly in one go, and I know that we shall all appreciate our new facilities. I'd like to thank everyone for their understanding during this time.

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CHALLENGE PARTNERS

RGS is part of a network of nearly 600 schools in the Challenge Partners programme. One important part of the work is that school leaders support each other with school Quality Assessment Reviews. We had a team of trained reviewers here earlier in the week; they observed lessons, scrutinised school data, and met with students, staff and governors. There will be a full report published in the next few weeks, but I am delighted to say that the team (comprising a retired Head and Ofsted Inspector, a serving Head, and several Deputy Heads) were very impressed with everything they saw. We felt an enormous sense of pride when the evidence was shared. Fine words butter no parsnips, of course, and we worked together through some areas which would benefit from a review so that further improvements can be made. These will also form a part of the report. Our outcomes for students, progress, emphasis on values and the building of character, the refreshed staff CPD and our co-curricular provision were highly praised for their excellence. I shall look forward to sharing the report with you.

We can learn much from other schools and I am pleased that a number of my Senior Team are trained as reviewers and will, themselves, be undertaking reviews elsewhere. I, too, have recently transformed myself from poacher to gamekeeper and have trained as an Ofsted Inspector which, again, will give me the opportunity a few times a year, to spend a day or two in other schools as well as getting under the skin of the framework through which schools are now inspected.
