## An ambitious programme of study...

All Sixth Form students start Year 12 with four subjects. About a third take all four into Year 13.



#### Why study four A levels?

- Breadth of study and academic enrichment
- The A level experience is very different to that of GCSE.
   Many students end up taking their '4th' A level to completion and drop 1<sup>st</sup>/2<sup>nd</sup>/3<sup>rd</sup> choice instead.

Our Additional Curriculum also gives you the opportunity to take a fifth subject, such as the EPQ, Critical Thinking, CCF, SLST, GCSE Italian, ab initio Chinese or Japanese.

- RGS students achieved an average of 80 % A\*-B grades over the past five years
- 50% of all grades were A\* or A in 2019 (the last public exam year)

# Sixth Form Options Choosing your A Levels



## **RGS Entry Criteria**



- At least 8 full taught GCSEs Grade 9 4
  - Minimum 49 points from best 8 (= 7x6, 1x7)
  - Minimum 52 to make first choices more likely
- English and Maths at minimum Grade 5
- Specific entry requirements for all subjects. See booklet for further details
- NB: Some degrees require specific GCSE grades in some subjects check courses on UCAS
- All students must qualify for and take 4 subjects in Y12

#### How to choose



- Have I looked closely at course content? Do I think I will enjoy it? Do
  I think I will be good at it? Am I really interested in it?
- Am I prepared for the jump from GCSE to A level?
- Do I need a specific subject or type of subject for a university course or career I'm interested in? Have I checked course entry requirements? Will I attain them in this subject?

#### How not to choose



- I'm doing it because my friend is
- I like it but I'm not choosing it because my friend doesn't like it
- I really like my current teacher
- My parent told me to do it but I don't really like it
- I can't be bothered to think about the future

#### Points to consider



- Science + Arts/Humanities a good mix
- Physics + Maths rare to take Physics without Maths
- 4 x essay writing subjects a heavy (but not impossible) load
- 4 x CW/project subjects a heavy (but not impossible) load
- At least 2 subjects studied at GCSE
- 5<sup>th</sup> subject Column E
- Co-curricular

# Additional Subject Choice Column Enrichment

### **Y12** into **Y13**



- 3 A Levels ideally DDD minimum to ensure maximum post school choice
- To continue with 4 A Levels AABB minimum in end of Year 12 exams
- End of Year 12 exams and work throughout Y12 = UCAS predictions

- An ideal stepping stone to university life
- Results achieved by Year 13 boarders 10-15 % above school average at A\*-B
