### YEAR 11 STUDY LEAVE FOR PUBLIC EXAMS – MAY / JUNE 2022

From the beginning of the summer term until study leave, lessons will be focussed on revision topics. Study leave for your son (when he may revise for his exams at home) will run as below. I have included some other details for your information.

- Monday 9<sup>th</sup> May GCSE Spanish/German orals – no study leave
- Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> May GCSE Spanish/German orals – no study leave
- Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> May Last teaching day. Study leave begins at 1530
- Thursday 12<sup>th</sup> May GCSE French orals
- Friday 13<sup>th</sup> May GCSE French orals
- 16<sup>th</sup> May – 29<sup>th</sup> Jun Public exams (includes the designated contingency days at the end of the period for which all students must remain available)
- Thursday 30<sup>th</sup> June Sixth Form Taster Day (for all those wishing to return to the RGS Sixth Form) and Book Return
- Friday 1<sup>st</sup> July Free at last!

Please note:

- Students will not be able to use the Lower Library for revision as this area is used by other classes.
- Free classrooms will be available for unsupervised private study. A list will be posted on the Library door.

Some students may wish to see their teachers during study leave so that they can receive clarification about material they have revised or get a past paper marked. Up to half term, Year 11 teachers will be available in their classrooms or department areas at their usual teaching times for individual or group support. After half term, revision sessions may be arranged within departments. We encourage all boys to seek this support if they need it.

In the case of a few students, the Head of Year will contact their parents for further discussion regarding study leave.

**Please remind your son that whenever on school premises during the exam period he should be in full school uniform as required for his year group.**

Year 11 are reminded that the Sixth Form Taster Day takes place on **Thursday 30<sup>th</sup> June**. Attendance is compulsory for all those wishing to return in the Sixth Form.

I wish your son every success in his exams and offer a gentle reminder that these are the last public exams universities will see so an impressive set of results (Grades 9/8/7 if he is contemplating highest/high tariff universities) is vital. I look forward to seeing him return as a new Year 12 student.
