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

Congratulations to current students Sam Metcalf and Drew Padfield who have both been offered degree apprenticeships with Ernst and Young and The Dyson Institute!

Sam:

"I applied for the Business Academy work experience summer 2020 at Ernst and Young. I had to sit two tests and an interview before they offered me the work experience. Due to covid I had to do the work experience online. During the work experience I had a good introduction to the world of accounting and I then had the opportunity to apply for the apprenticeship which is a 4-year, Level 7 Apprenticeship including the Chartered Accountancy qualification. I had to sit more tests and two further interviews, and I was very fortunate to be offered the role starting September 2021. Overall it was a great experience; with all the preparation I had to do I am now prepared for another interview too."

Drew:

"Dyson stood out to me as there are around 40 apprentices each year studying, living, and working together in a 'year group' making it more like a university experience rather than there only being a handful of apprentices. Hearing that the apprentices at the Institute of Engineering were able to work on projects from day one and were treated as any other employee also inspired me to apply. The degree also appeals to me as I will be able to experience four different areas of engineering (mechanical, electronics, electromechanical and software) before I specialise for Years 3 and 4 and complete a BEng. Being able to learn a new formula or principle one day and then put it to use at a company at the forefront of new technologies just seemed amazing to me. By doing an apprenticeship, I will have completed my degree whilst also having four years work experience. Lastly, as the Dyson apprentices work for three days and are taught two days a week, they are paid a salary and have no tuition fees."
