Dear Parents,

Schools, nationwide, are facing challenging times, and it is during these that we see our communities pull together. As shared, a number of RGS staff have been self-isolating during this recent period. - Please ensure your son is wearing school branded kit for Games lessons. If he does not have a school tracksuit he should wear blue/black tracksuit bottoms and his school blazer and a coat. He should not wear a hoodie.
